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Impact. We all long to make one, and we will, whether positive or negative. But in a culture obsessed with instant results and flash-in-the-pan success, we must remember that true impact, eternal impact, never comes quickly or without cost. It grows slowly, quietly, and faithfully through alignment, long-term investment, and multiplication.

Impact requires alignment with mission and values.

For BMA Global, impact happens when we do what God has called us to do: multiply disciples, leaders, and churches around the world. When churches, missionaries, regional leaders, and partners move in the same direction with the same purpose, our influence grows exponentially.



In II Timothy 2:2, Paul calls Timothy to stay focused on the message entrusted to him. Alignment means staying anchored to the gospel that changes everything, committed to the Mission of God, and focused on the task, not distracted by lesser priorities. Alignment produces clarity. Clarity produces unity. Unity produces impact.

Impact requires long-term investment.

God has greatly blessed the efforts of BMA Global throughout its 75 years. The multiplication of disciples, leaders, and churches in approximately 75 countries testifies to faithful, prolonged investment rather than quick strategies or human ideas. Planting churches in hard places, developing local leaders, strengthening partnerships, and mobilizing sending churches all require time, presence, perseverance, and stewardship.

Paul did not call Timothy to pursue short-term results but to invest deeply in people who would invest in others. The work of fulfilling God's mission is generational. Impact grows slowly, but it endures.

Impact requires intentional multiplication.

Impact multiplies only when disciples, leaders, and churches reproduce themselves. II Timothy 2:2 reveals four generations of influence: Paul → Timothy → faithful men → others also. This model drives BMA Global's commitment to lasting impact.

We pursue this by making disciple-making our core task, developing national leaders, planting churches that plant churches, creating reproducible systems, and practicing leadership that equips rather than centralizes. Multiplication is not accidental; it is strategic obedience.

We pray this Impact Report blesses you and ignites your heart for God's mission. When God's people remain aligned, invested, and committed to multiplication, our impact will outlive our moment and shape lives and churches for generations to come.

Financial Impact

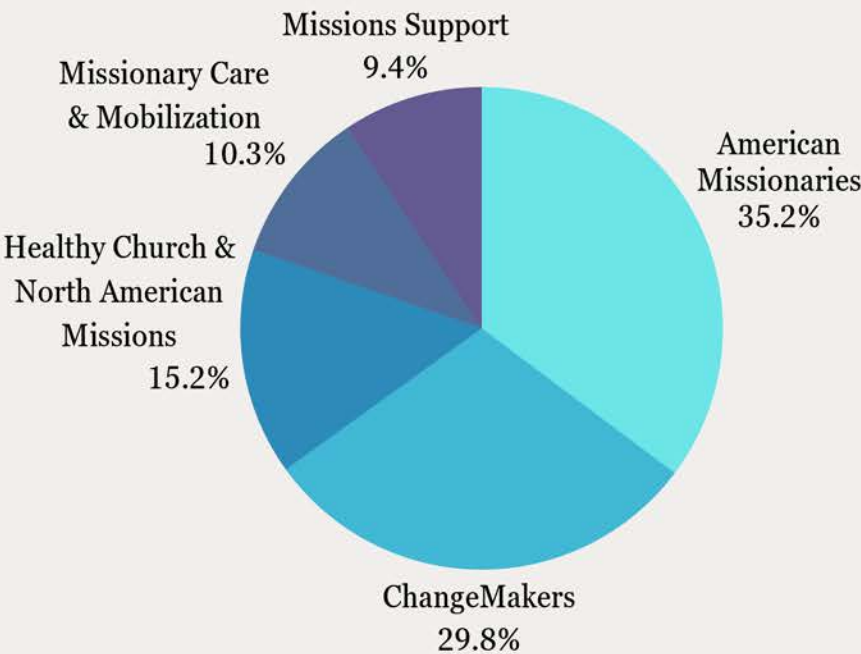
We are blessed and grateful for your generosity. Your support is making a difference!

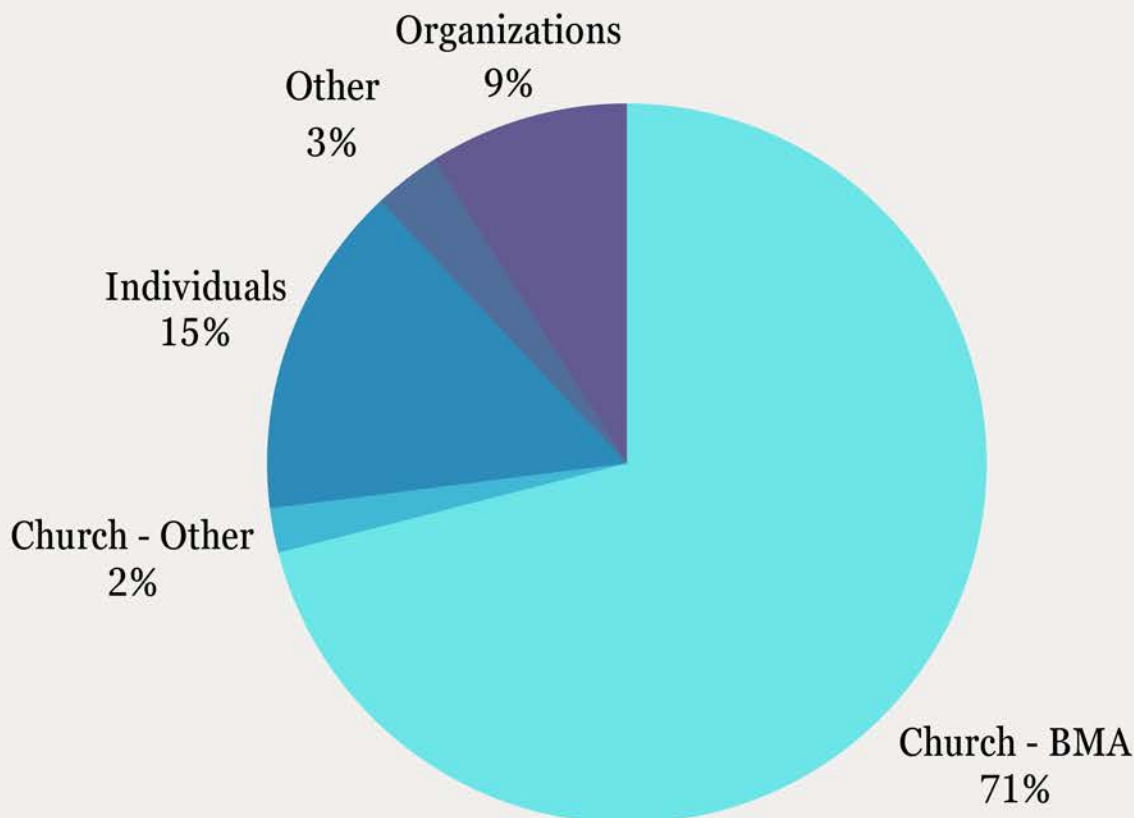

World Missions Fund

Formerly known as the General Fund, the World Missions Fund supports our North American church planters, Healthy Church Solutions, ministries that serve our missionaries, and—most significantly—our ChangeMakers.

We have 1,100 churches.



But only 52% contribute to the World Missions Fund.



We've seen a decline of 10% participation in giving to this fund over the last 5 years.

We are prayerfully asking God to raise up more partnering churches who will join us in the mission.

BMA Global's work across Africa is marked by rapid growth, strong national leadership, and a clear commitment to multiplication. The gospel is spreading through both American missionary families and an expanding network of trained African pastors who are planting new churches in their own communities.

A Growing Network of Churches

Across countries such as Zambia, Ghana, Burkina Faso, and Tanzania, local churches are growing and reproducing. These congregations are not only seeing new believers come to Christ but are also taking the lead in planting additional churches, creating a grassroots movement that is expanding far beyond the reach of traditional missionary efforts.

American missionary families currently serving in Zambia and South Africa are strengthening existing ministries and helping establish new ones. Their presence provides stability, training, and encouragement as African leaders continue to carry the mission forward.



Leadership Development Through Training Centers

Bible training centers have become essential pillars of BMA Global's African strategy. These centers equip pastors and lay leaders with solid biblical teaching and practical ministry skills. As leaders graduate, they return to their communities ready to disciple believers, start new churches, and train the next generation.

This emphasis on indigenous leadership is producing a multiplication effect: trained leaders plant churches, those churches raise up more leaders, and the cycle continues.

Battling Challenges with Faith and Perseverance

Despite ongoing challenges, including the influence of animistic traditions, political corruption, poverty, and the spread of unbiblical prosperity movements, the work is flourishing. Leaders like Moses in Ghana, Clement in Burkina Faso, and Renatus in Tanzania exemplify faithful, humble ministry in difficult environments.

Their commitment shows that strong local leadership is one of the greatest keys to sustainable gospel work in Africa.

BMA Global's work across Asia includes a wide range of ministry contexts—from open countries to highly restricted creative-access nations—and BMA Global is committed to advancing the gospel through adaptable, locally driven strategies.



Church Planting Across East and Southeast Asia

Across countries like Cambodia, Vietnam, Papua New Guinea, and several creative-access nations, BMA Global partners with local leaders to plant new churches and strengthen existing ones.

In areas with strict political or religious controls, ministry often takes the form of small house churches that meet quietly in homes and workplaces. More than 100 house churches are now gathering in India and Myanmar, many led by ChangeMakers committed to evangelism and discipleship. These congregations continue to grow as believers share the gospel relationally and disciple new followers of Christ in everyday settings.

In more open areas like Thailand and the Philippines, churches are able to gather publicly and engage in broader discipleship efforts.

Philippines: A Missionary-Sending Hub

A major part of the current strategy centers on equipping Filipino believers as tentmaker missionaries. Because Filipino workers can enter many Asian countries with fewer restrictions, they serve in places where Western missionaries cannot easily go. These leaders use their professional skills to gain access, build relationships, and plant gospel seeds in culturally sensitive ways.

BMA Philippines is becoming the primary missionary-sending force for the region, training and deploying leaders into South Asia, the Middle East, and other restricted nations.

BMA Global's ministry in Europe spans deeply secular Western nations and post-communist Eastern countries where spiritual wounds still shape daily life. Across the continent, missionaries and ChangeMakers are planting churches, discipling new believers, and partnering with local leaders to advance the gospel in environments that require patience, cultural sensitivity, and long-term commitment.

Central & Eastern Europe: Steady Growth Through Perseverance

In Romania and Ukraine, ministry is thriving as people respond to the gospel with openness and hunger. Local leaders and ChangeMakers are actively discipling new believers, forming new church groups, and strengthening existing congregations. Despite ongoing political instability in Ukraine, believers continue gathering, ministering, and expanding gospel presence across communities shaken by conflict.

Romania remains one of the most fruitful fields in the



region. Churches are growing, national leaders are emerging, and discipleship efforts are shaping communities with gospel hope.

In the Czech Republic, progress is slower. With some of the highest rates of atheism in Europe, many people are indifferent to spiritual matters. Ministry here requires deep relational investment and long-term presence. ChangeMaker Milan Bulak continues planting seeds faithfully, building connections, and creating space for gospel conversations in a difficult environment.

Western Europe: Ministry in Highly Secular Cultures

In France and Portugal, BMA Global is engaging communities shaped by generations of secularism. Evangelism is relational and patient, often beginning with simple acts of service and trust-building. In Portugal, ongoing work with local leaders is creating new opportunities for discipleship and church development.

France remains one of the most challenging fields. Many people see religion as irrelevant, making church planting a slow process. Even so, missionaries continue cultivating relationships, sharing Christ in everyday conversations, and preparing the ground for future church plants.

BMA Global's ministry in the Middle East continues to grow despite political volatility, economic instability, and substantial risks for believers. Through a network of trained national leaders—known as ChangeMakers—churches are being planted, house groups are forming, and the gospel is reaching places where access is limited.

Church Planting Across Eight Countries

Church planting efforts now extend across eight Middle Eastern countries. BMA-supported leaders are discipling new believers, establishing house churches, and meeting the needs of their communities with compassion and courage.

In Iraq, believers continue to gather and minister even as many have been displaced by conflict. Those who fled to safer areas such as Kurdistan and Turkey are forming new groups and sharing the gospel with fellow refugees.

In Syria, Lebanon, and nearby regions, small house gatherings are slowly and quietly developing into fully established congregations. The work is deliberate and patient, allowing relationships and trust to grow naturally.

The ChangeMaker Strategy

Much of the ministry is carried out by trained national leaders who understand the culture, language, and spiritual



andscape. These ChangeMakers lead Bible studies, plant churches, and disciple new believers, often at personal risk.

Their efforts allow the gospel to take root in places where traditional missionary presence is limited or impossible.

Hope in Difficult Places

Despite persecution, displacement, and social pressure, the church continues to grow. New leaders are emerging, new groups are gathering, and the gospel is moving forward in some of the world's most challenging environments.

The mission is demanding, but the fruit—changed lives, new believers, and expanding congregations—continues to testify to God's power and faithfulness in the Middle East.

BMA Global's church planting in North America spans a vast and diverse mission field, reaching people from dozens of cultures, languages, and religious backgrounds. From Canada's French-speaking cities to immigrant communities in major U.S. metros and spiritually resistant small towns, BMA church planters are establishing gospel-rooted churches designed to multiply.

Across Canada, Utah, Louisiana, Minnesota, New York, Georgia, Texas, Arizona, and Florida, these church plants share a common thread: relational ministry that leads to evangelism, discipleship, and the formation of new gospel communities.



Reaching the Nations at Home

In cities like Lévis, Quebec; the Bronx, New York; Orlando, Florida; and El Cajon, California, missionaries serve among multicultural neighborhoods filled with immigrants and refugees seeking stability and hope. Many come from Catholic, Pentecostal, Muslim, or secular backgrounds, requiring patient, contextual evangelism. Arabic-speaking ministries in Texas, Arizona, California, and Florida are also growing, discipling people from across the Middle East and North Africa and planting culturally specific Arabic churches across the U.S.

Strengthening Believers and Equipping Leaders

In Minneapolis, Chicago's Metro East, and Phoenix,

church planters focus on life-on-life discipleship, helping new believers mature in their faith and training local men and women to become future pastors, church planters, and ministry leaders. Many church plants consist largely of first-generation believers, creating both tremendous opportunities and discipleship challenges.

Reaching Spiritually Difficult Places

In Morgan, Utah, and Ruston, Louisiana, church planters work in regions marked by either dominant religious culture or broad spiritual apathy. Small groups, home meetings, community involvement, and



intentional relationships form the backbone of these church-planting efforts.

A Movement Multiplying

Across the country, Hispanic ministries are expanding rapidly. Through leadership residencies, theological training, and mentoring, BMA Global is strengthening over 60 Hispanic churches and equipping leaders to reach one of the most responsive people groups in North America.

From urban centers to rural towns, BMA Global's vision remains consistent: make disciples, plant healthy churches, and equip leaders who will multiply the gospel across North America.

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SOUTH

BMA Global's work in South America is marked by an expanding network of local churches, new church plants, and national leaders taking ownership of the mission. Across the continent, discipleship and church-planting movements continue to spread, driven increasingly by indigenous believers equipped to reach their own communities.

A Self-Sustaining Movement

In several South American countries, churches originally planted through missionary efforts have grown into self-governing, mission-focused networks. Local leaders are discipling believers, planting new congregations, and, most notably, sending out their own missionaries to neighboring countries. This shift reflects an encouraging movement from externally supported missions toward strong, sustainable national leadership.

In Peru, for example, churches are not only multiplying but also training and sending missionaries into unreached areas. In other regions, new church plants are appearing that BMA leaders in the U.S. did not even know existed, evidence of organic, locally driven growth fueled by the gospel itself.



Uneven Growth Across the Continent

While some countries have thriving, mature church networks, others remain early in the development process. Uruguay and Argentina currently have only one BMA-affiliated congregation each, highlighting the need for additional workers, leadership development, and long-term investment. These nations face strong secularism, presenting unique challenges that require patient, relational evangelism.



Meanwhile, in remote areas along the Venezuela-Colombia border, missionaries are reaching communities where no churches previously existed. The primary need in these regions is for mentors, disciplers, and coaches who can help new believers grow in their faith and eventually lead emerging churches.

Breaking Through Spiritual Barriers

Spiritual syncretism remains a significant challenge throughout rural and urban South America. While many people identify culturally as Catholic, their beliefs often blend with animistic traditions, creating confusion and resistance to the gospel. Even so, the message of Christ continues to transform lives as new believers reject old practices and embrace a clear, biblical faith.

MEXICO, AMERICA &

BMA Global's work across Mexico, Central America, and the Caribbean is thriving through strong networks of local churches, national leaders, and mission partnerships. The region is marked by vibrant congregations, expanding church-planting initiatives, and a growing commitment to raise up the next generation of gospel workers.

Mexico:

Renewed Momentum in Leadership Development

In Mexico, more than 100 congregations are actively engaged in disciple-making and church-planting efforts. A renewed emphasis has emerged among national leaders to train new pastors and planters who will lead future works.

The national BMA Bible Institute serves as a central hub for theological training and ministry preparation. ChangeMaker Josue Osorio leads the institute, helping to equip young leaders who feel called to plant new churches and strengthen existing ones. Across the country, churches are united in their desire to reach the lost, invest in leadership development, and send workers into both local communities and cross-cultural mission fields.

Central America & the Caribbean: National Leaders at the Front Lines

Throughout Central America and the Caribbean, national pastors now lead all BMA-connected ministries. These leaders are developing their own mission strategies, planting churches, and discipling believers in environments often marked by economic hardship, political instability, and frequent natural disasters



BMA Global supports these leaders through ongoing training sessions, Bible classes, and strategic guidance. Lifeword plays a major role in the region as well, helping proclaim the gospel through radio, streaming, and digital media, especially in places where missionary presence is limited or where in-person ministry is difficult.

A significant sign of maturity in the region is the increasing number of missionaries being sent out by local churches. National believers are now taking the gospel to unreached areas in their own countries and even crossing national borders to support global missions.

Ministry isn't one-size-fits-all. Healthy Church Solutions offers a tailored, Spirit-led approach—listening to pastors, offering guidance (not directives), and coaching teams to discern the Spirit's leadership for their unique context.

This year, we organized our resources into three core areas:

Connection: Leadership doesn't have to be lonely. We help pastors and ministry leaders build meaningful relationships for encouragement, shared growth, and spiritual strengthening.

- Bi-weekly Pastor Zoom Gatherings: A space for pastors to connect, encourage one another, receive training, and access free resources.
- Free Coaching: Coaching for clarity, healthy rhythms, and resilient ministry.

Content: We equip leaders for healthy, prayerful ministry through evaluations, trainings, free downloads, and more at healthychurchsolutions.org.

- The Healthy Church Podcast: Hosted by Larry Barker and Drew Cline, offering honest, practical leadership conversations. Listen on major platforms, the HCS website, or Facebook.
- RightNow Media Library: Free access for BMA pastors and ministry teams to a video library on discipleship, leadership, evangelism, conflict management, and more.
- In-Person Training: Live trainings on discipleship, multiplication, coaching, revitalization, systems building, and other key ministry topics.

Conferences: We promote healthy rhythms by encouraging pastors and leaders to schedule quarterly prayer retreats and an annual time for rest and renewal.

- Prayer Retreats: Regional 24-hour retreats for pastors and one-day retreats for church leadership teams.
- Men's Retreats: Launched in 2025 in Gary, Texas to invest in men's spiritual leadership; expanding to Texas and Arkansas in 2026.
- ReCharge Conference: Our annual fall leadership conference, with ReCharge 2026 set for September 28–30 in Grapevine, Texas.

By God's grace, we currently connect with 8–10 pastors each day. Our vision is to pour into, resource, coach, train, and encourage 250 leaders each month—one pastor, one church, one leader at a time.

We are dedicated to:
